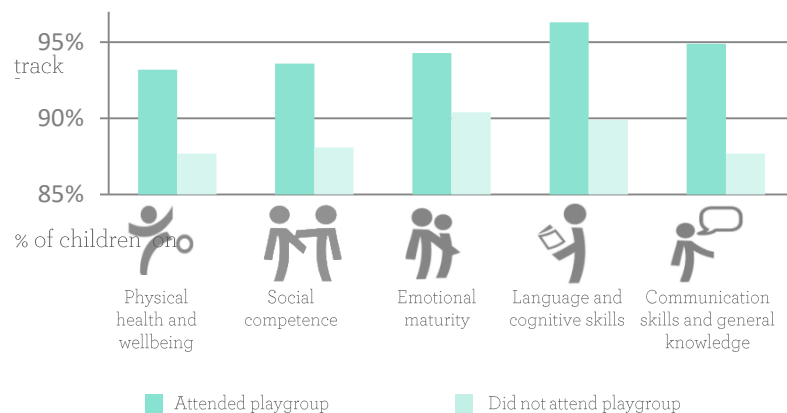


Kids who go to playgroup are more likely to be developmentally on-track.

- Strengthen muscles in fingers and hands



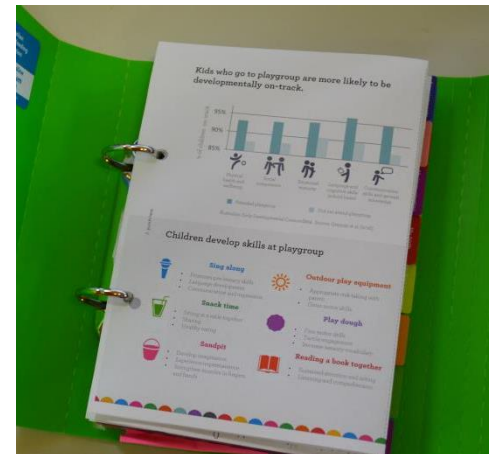
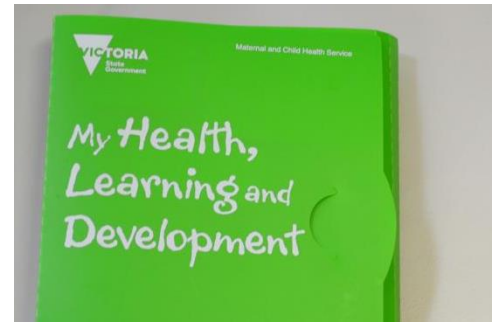
Reading a book together
